THE ICKD CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The International Collective for Kids Driving (ICKD) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the ICKD's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

- 1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
- 2. Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
- 3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
- 4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.

The ICKD urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

CHILD PROTECTION POLICY

The BEF (British Equestrian Federation) places the highest priority on safety and enjoyment, and recognises that it has a Duty of Care towards children within the horse industry. Every adult has a legal and moral responsibility to protect young people from abuse in sport.

Therefore all possible steps have been taken to ensure the safety and protection of children according to the BEF Duty of Care – Child Protection Guidelines and the Children's Act 2004, at this event

English, Scottish and Welsh Competitors will be expected to enter as individuals and then Teams for each Nation will be chosen by their respective Chef d'equipes.

Entries in Principle will be expected for all UK Competitors as well as invited National Federations (see notes page 13)

All Competitors must be members of Indoor Horse Driving Trials UK at the time of the Event. Temporary membership can be obtained by completion of the entry form and payment of the relevant fee.

Teams

To be part of the Team classification a Nation must have at least 3 Competitors in at least 2 different classes out of classes 1,2,3 and 4. Entries in Class 0, class 5 and class 6 will only be open to individual classification.

Each Nation is allowed to enter up to 8 Competitors for the team classification. Additional Individual Classification entries will be welcomed but may be limited by the Organising Committee after Nominated Entries have closed.

Should a NF or Association for Kids Driving only be able to send 3 Competitors in a minimum of 2 Classes (between classes 1, 2,3 & 4) they must be entered as a Team.

In addition each Nation or Association is entitled to send a Chef d'equipe and a Veterinarian who will be accorded the same privileges as the Competitors.

NFs which cannot send a Team may send up to 2 Competitors in different Classes.

A NF or Association for Kids Driving which cannot send a Team may enter one Competitor as an Individual.

A Spare Pony may be entered for each Team. The Competitor who uses the Spare Pony will be eligible for the individual classification as well as for the Team classification. The Spare Pony can only be substituted once not later than one hour before the start of Competition 1 and must be notified in writing to the Organizer.

The Host Nation is entitled to enter twice the number of Competitors. (106.3)

6. STABLES

Sizes of boxes 3 X 3 (Permanent stabling) Some Horse accommodation may be provided in temporary stabling depending on numbers.

Competitors are encouraged to bring their own stabling. Some paddocks may also be available for hire from the show organisers.
