Children's Challenge

A world cup style competition in the main arena late afternoon of Friday 10th April which is especially for children not entering a Championship class.

To enter, drivers are to

- Be aged between 6yrs and 14yrs
- Have competed in at least 3 regional events during the 2025 / 2026 season
- Have not qualified for Novice Junior Championship or any other class
- May not enter any other class at the Championship
- Is a member of ICD

Depending on entries there may be two classes: 6 to 11 years, 10 to 14 years.
The class is FREE to enter.

Sharing

Please give ALL DETAILS on your entry form of all the sharing inc pony names. Ponies that compete in more than one class will need a sufficient break between classes and we may ask the vet to check them before their second class.

NOTE: Animals may only enter 2 classes at the championships; this includes the Children's Challenge. Once entries close, all late changes (sharing, withdrawals etc) need to be reported to Kayti Harvey (scdc.kayti.harvey@gmail.com) as soon as possible, the closer to the start of the event, the harder it might be for us to help... but we will try!

Booking Stabling

Arena UK Overnight Stabling Charges

One night	Per stable	£57.00 + VAT = £68.40
Two nights	Per stable	£77.00 + VAT = £92.40
Three nights	Per stable	£87.00 + VAT = £104.40

NOTE: This is for the first 140 stables, costs increase by about £5 per night if extra temporary stables are required.

Electrical Hook Up

- £35 + VAT (£42) per night and is bookable online directly with Arena UK
- Must be booked in advance.
- Only one vehicle per hook up. One EHU point and two lead take offs are NOT permitted.

SAFETY: Caravans/living area on horse boxes MUST have an up-to-date 3kg (min) FIRE EXTINGUISHERS on board and easily accessible by the groom's door. Fire Blankets are recommended next to cooking apparatus.

To book stables and EHU please go to: www.arenauk.com (near top of the page to the right-hand side, click on 'Stables & Hook-up Bookings and Arena Hire'), you will require card/payment details and vehicle registration/details to make the booking.

General Information

Animal Welfare

- Animal Welfare and the Social License to operate (SLO) is important to ICD.
- A Welfare Officer is appointed for the event, and a Vet is on site each day.
- Animals may only enter 2 classes at the championships; this includes the Children's Challenge.
- Animal husbandry, driving standards, use of the voice and of the driving aid (whip) will be observed at all times.

Equine Passports & Vaccinations

- Passports can be checked beforehand by submitting online when making your entry but will also be required by the Arena UK Stable manager on arrival on site and spot checked by the ICD Secretary.
- Equine Flu vaccinations MUST be up to date and show the primary course of two vaccinations followed by the six-month booster then annually, meaning on or before the same date in the following year.
- A vaccination must not be given within 7 days of the event.
- Providing the first two vaccinations have been given, the pony / horse may enter, providing the second vaccination is more than 7 days before the Championships.
- ICD advise, but do not insist, on vaccinations being given within 6 months of the Championships.

Stallions

- Must wear a disk on their headcollar and bridle at all times stating they are a stallion.

Small Ponies

- Must not exceed 112cm (44" - 11 hands.)
- Ponies close to the height limit may be asked to produce a current height certificate or letter from a Veterinary stating their height.

Dress, Harness & Vehicles

- Smart Marathon Dress and safe clean equipment to be used throughout the competition.
- Young Drivers (under the age of 18 years) MUST wear body protectors during all phases.
- Body protectors MUST be worn by all during the obstacle phase and recommended for all phases.
- **Back protectors are no longer permitted for any driver or backstepper**

Dogs

- Dogs must be kept on a lead and under proper control at all times.
- NO DOGS are allowed in the arenas whilst walking the cones, P&P and obstacles.
- All dog mess to be removed immediately, there are ample bins on site.

Stabling

- NO HORSE/PONY MAY BE TIED TO A LORRY/TRAILER AND LEFT UNATTENDED
- NO HORSE/PONY MAY BE LEFT INSIDE A LORRY/TRAILER OVER NIGHT
- No horse / pony may be left in side-stabling overnight
- One stable must be booked for each horse and pony over 11 hands
- Two small ponies may share one stable, provided they are 11 hands or under and normally live together and their welfare is not compromised.
- Stables will be available from THURSDAY afternoon unless otherwise / previously arranged with Arena UK.
- On arrival, please park as directed by stable manager; do not off load until you have checked in with the Stable Manager.

- Please put your horse in the stable you are allocated only.
- Stables will clean and empty on arrival.
- A clean box deposit will be required on arrival which will be refunded if the stable is left in a clean and fully mucked out state as found on arrival.
- Shavings only may be used, bring your own or they can be purchased from Arena UK when booking stable(s) via the Arena UK Website. No other type of bedding to be used on site please.
- Bring your own tools to take care of the stable and to pick up droppings around your horsebox.
- Clear your beds to the muckheap only and put rubbish/litter in bins provided.
- NO SMOKING is permitted within the stabling at any time.

On Site Catering

 - Open during the day (Fri to Sun), serving hot meals, tea, coffee etc.

Recognising horses are intelligent and emotional beings, we always prioritise their mental and physical health and overall wellbeing.




Care
